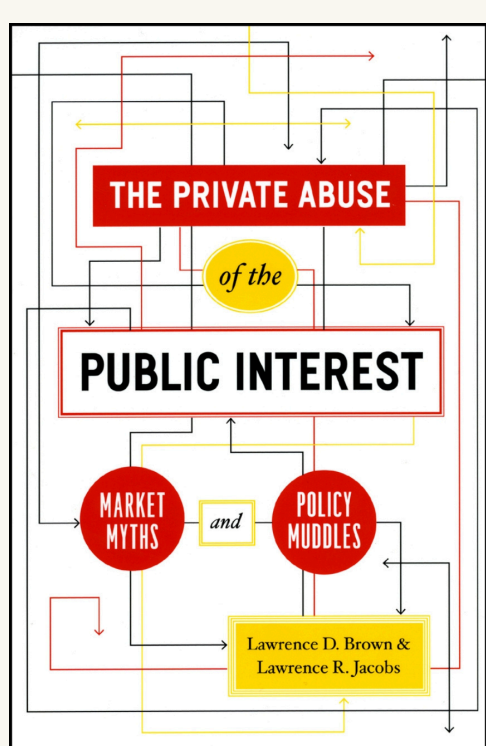

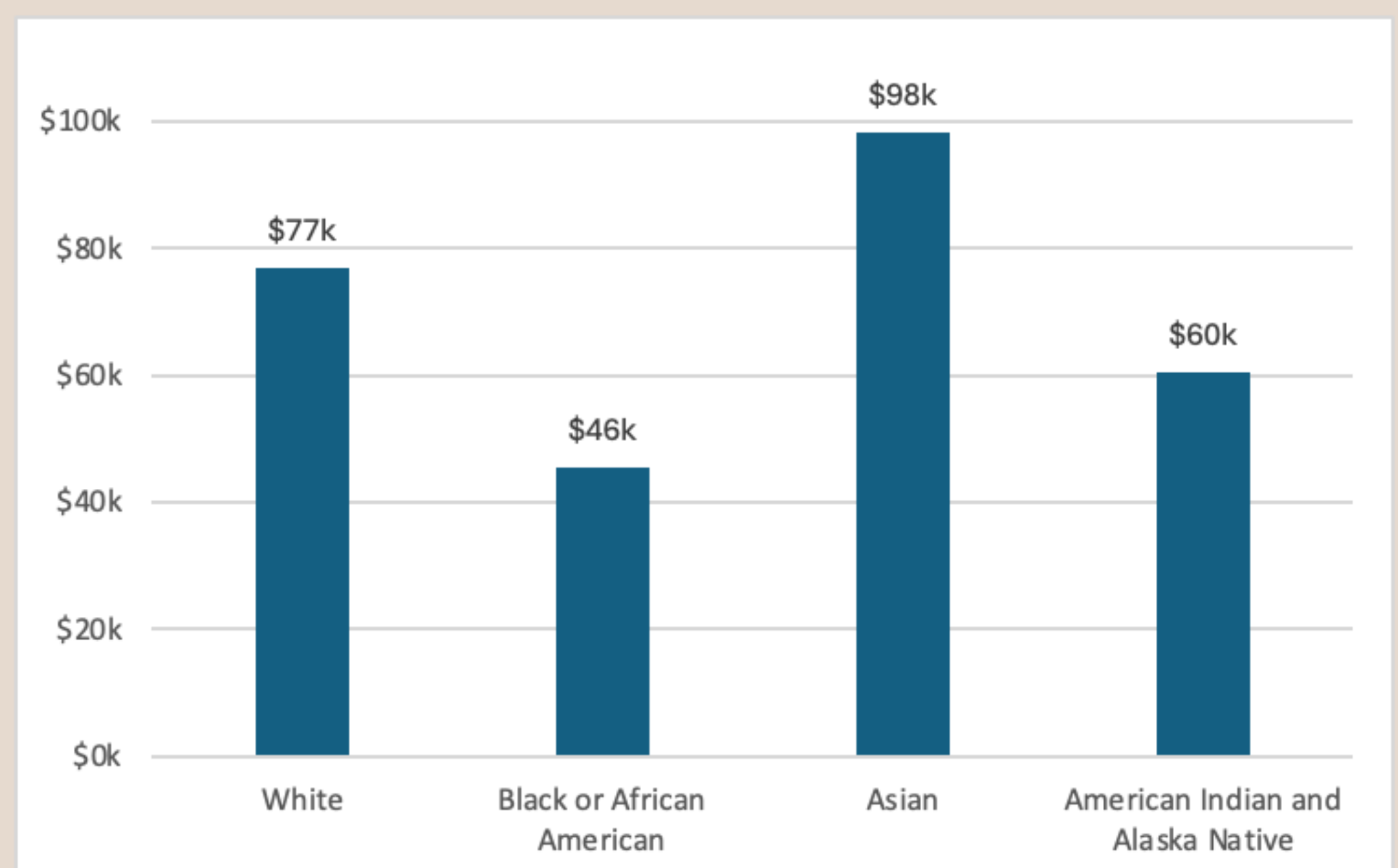
1. Wellness Retreat Center Market Study
