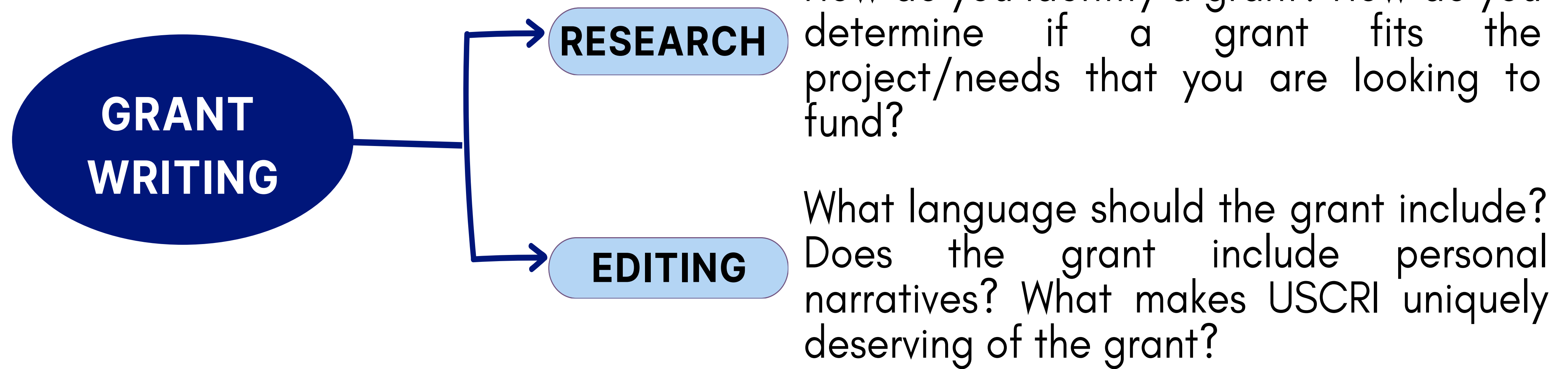
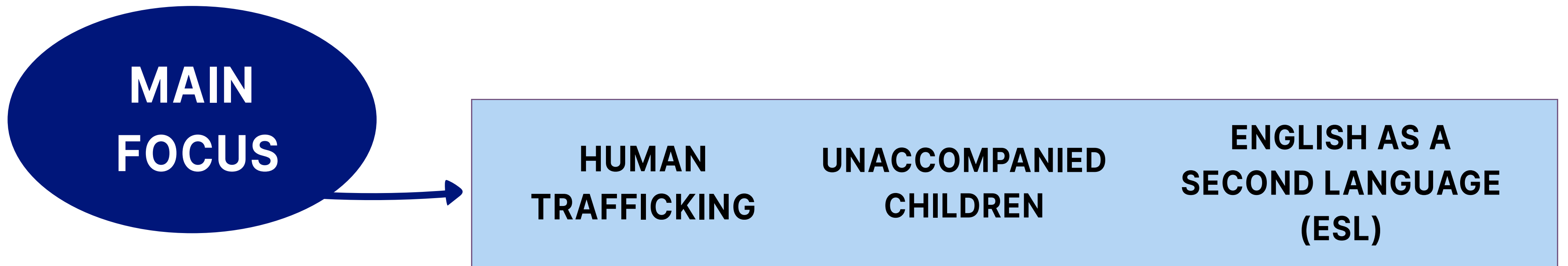

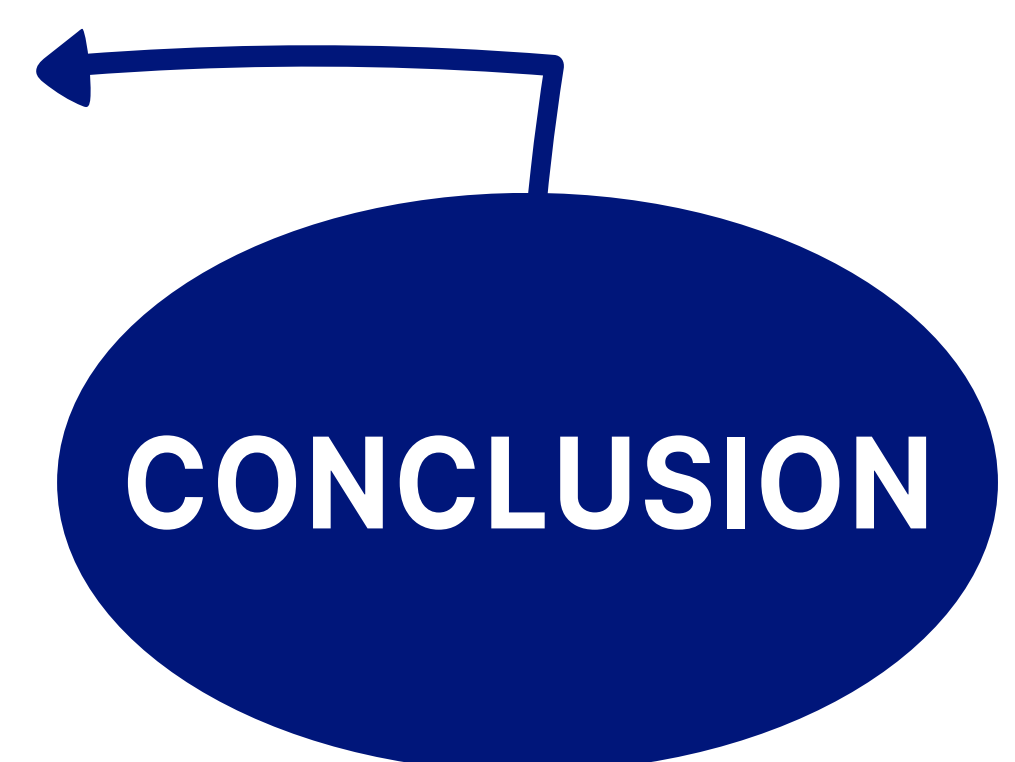


- Virtual ESL Program: the goal of this grant is to fund a virtual ESL program, which means that refugees would be able to take pre-beginner English classes virtually.
- This step is essential because there is a gap between refugee literacy levels and the state-sponsored ESL classes.



- Nuevo Comienzo: we hope to fund operational support for Nuevo Comienzo, a legal assistance program for unaccompanied children.
- Nuevo Comienzo will also use grant funds to host a panel of unaccompanied children who are part of Nuevo Comienzo to uplift their experiences.
